

#### THIS WEEK'S FEATURED ARTWORK

The Birth of Saint John the Baptist, by Artemisia Gentileschi (approx) 1635

In this rendition of the scene, Artemisia Gentileschi illuminates the humility and strength of the maidservants who marvel at the miracle of John's birth. John's elderly mother Elizabeth, who could not have children before becoming pregnant with John, rests in the shadows after labor. Sitting at a desk holding a pen in the dark left edge of the painting is his father Zechariah, writing the name "John." He was told of the pregnancy by an angel and silenced for doubting.



Artemisia's use of light and shadows points to Caravaggio's influence on her painting. She grew up with Caravaggio and other famous Baroque painters in her father Orazio Gentileschi's studio in Rome.
