THIS WEEK'S FEATURED ARTWORK

Madonna and Child, by Sadao Watanabe, wood block print, 1988 Sadao Watanabe (1913 – 1996) was a Japanese printmaker who created biblical prints rendered in the mingei (folk art) tradition of Japan. A student of the master textile dye artist Serizawa Keisuke, Watanabe uses kozo paper (from mulberry tree) and momigami (kneaded paper). The momigami paper was crumpled by hand, squeezed and wrinkled to give a rough quality to the prints. In this depiction of Madonna and Child, Mary holds the swaddled Christ child close to her body. Her crossed arms and kimono merge to create a flowing quality to the work. The red background is highlighted by the bright red cheeks of both mother and child.
