These will then be given to UMCOR, the United Methodist Committee on Relief, to help with relief efforts in the U.S. and around the world. Hygiene kits provide basic necessities to those who are most vulnerable during times of crisis and are distributed during disasters, whether socio-economic or as the result of a natural occurrence. Each kit includes a hand towel, wash cloth, bar of soap, tooth brush, tooth paste, nail clippers, and bandaids. Simple items, but to those most vulnerable it can truly make an impact and lift spirits.
