



Lent 2025

Lent is the 40-day period (not including Sundays), beginning with Ash Wednesday (March 5) and ending with the celebration of Easter (April 20). The 40 days is a symbolic reminder of lesus' fasting and temptation in the wilderness following his baptism. In the early church, it was the time set aside for preparing candidates for baptism. It is a penitential season for all Christians, an invitation to repent of our sins and return to God in our daily living. The spiritual practices for Lent include fasting, prayer and almsgiving. Each of these practices provide space and time for self-reflection. We examine our lives, confess our sins, and ask God for forgiveness. It is a journey from the ashes that symbolize our mortality to the empty tomb that proclaims the resurrection of lesus and new life for all. We are providing a full schedule of opportunities to observe a holy and meaningful Lent at First UMC. See in this insert, and the church website: www.santamonicaumc.org/lent
