

The 2026 Annual Giving Stewardship Campaign invites us each and all to prayerfully consider our financial pledge to support the mission and ministries of First UMC. Last Sunday, we heard First UMC member Sam Johnson give a Stewardship moment.



Here are a few excerpts:

"When I first came to this church, I put money into the collection plate because that's what you do. That's what my parents did. But also, because I was getting something I deeply valued: respite from my worries, from my cares. The strength for the week ahead. Spiritual uplift. A good sermon. A chance to sing and be part of this little community. Plus, donuts. But when I was asked to be a Trustee, that's when I came to fully appreciate the extent to which this church serves a much greater community stretching far beyond these pews. Did you know that for years a Swedish school has met here on Tuesday evenings? Did you know that Seven Arrows Elementary School, a really great little school, had to relocate after the fires?...Every day they use our kitchens to prepare lunches for their students...The Santa Monica synagogue makes use of this campus for High Holy Days and special events. And until just recently, when they found their own place, the Islamic Center also held services here. That's three faiths worshiping harmoniously under one roof. That is a mitzvah. Plus, we also housed a Santa Monica quilt guild. Some would say that's a fourth faith. And of course, we have our beautiful Preschool. If you want a little joy in your life, come to the courtyard when school lets out. These organizations bring income to the church, but from Upward Bound House all the way to the village of Sobiet in Haiti, we also serve and comfort, feed and shelter the needy—to say nothing of the victims of unexpected calamities. The Palisades Fire affected all of us, some more directly than others. We pray for our friends and neighbors, but we also stand by to help in material ways—whether that's opening the chapel to members of the Community Methodist Church in the Palisades, or helping the parents of our preschool replace the sand here because of toxic fallout from the smoke.... As our friend Martha Ross said so beautifully last year: this is not like paying a utility bill. This is an expression of my values—who I am, and who I want to be. And I do want to be the hope..."

First UMC Financial Stewardship FAQs

Generous giving is a vital sign of our faithful discipleship in Christ Jesus.

We give out of a sense of generosity and joy, mindful of our many blessings and eager to support the mission and ministries that bring life and hope within our congregation and throughout our community.

Why is my financial support of First UMC important?

We each have a vital part to play, sharing of the riches God has entrusted to us to undergird the on-going work of our congregation and equip it for the future God unfolds.

How is my financial support of First UMC used?

Our regular and generous giving supports our mission in four main areas—worship life (30%), congregation and community care (20%), local and world outreach (20%), and youth, children, families (30%). Support for these ministries also comes from facility usage, Trustees invested funds, our Methodist Foundation funds, and our Preschool.

What is a pledge?

A pledge is your commitment to give a stated amount to First UMC for the year—usually in monthly payments (or weekly or quarterly, if that works better for you). Your pledge helps us budget and plan for the year. We welcome cash, checks, credit cards via our secure on-line website, automatic checking drafts, and gifts of appreciated stock. The church business office is happy to assist you with any of these options.

What is an appropriate pledge amount?

The amount of your pledge is between you and God. The traditional biblical standard is called a "tithe," giving 10% from the blessings we have received. Regular giving grows our hearts into a lifetime of extravagant generosity with what God reveals to us.

When am I asked to pledge?

The campaign for 2026 ends November 30. Each year, we consecrate (make holy) our giving during worship on **Consecration Sunday, November 23**. Bring your completed pledge card to bring forward in worship, or mail it into the church office, or set-up your pledge online.




TODAY! Church Charge Conference 2025
