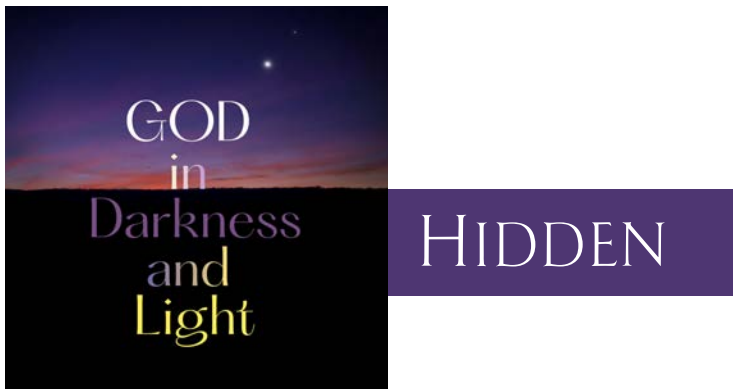

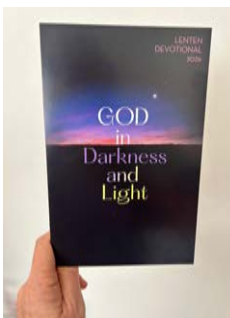


24th Annual St. Patrick's Day Luncheon

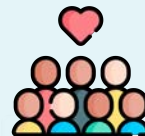

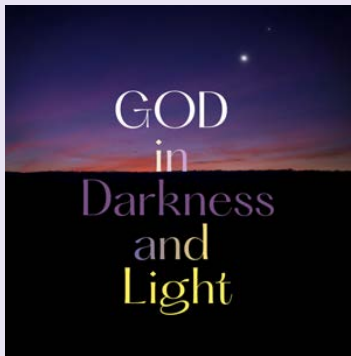

Lent is the 40-day period (not including Sundays), beginning with Ash Wednesday (**February 18**) and ending with the celebration of Easter (**April 5**). The 40 days is a symbolic reminder of Jesus' fasting and temptation in the wilderness following his baptism. In the early church, it was the time set aside for preparing candidates for baptism. It is a penitential season for all Christians, an invitation to repent of our sins and return to God in our daily living. The spiritual practices for Lent include fasting, prayer and almsgiving. Each of these practices provide space and time for self-reflection. We examine our lives, confess our sins, and ask God for forgiveness. It is a journey from the ashes that symbolize our mortality to the empty tomb that proclaims the resurrection of Jesus and new life for all. We are providing a full schedule of opportunities to observe a holy and meaningful Lent at First UMC.

All Church Service Trip (Intergenerational)

First UMC has a history of responding to disaster relief and engaging in long-term recovery efforts in various locations, including New Orleans, Haiti, and Houston.

Building on this deep foundation and history of service and outreach, we are

excited to announce a new initiative: a week-long intergenerational service trip

(**13 years and up**) scheduled from **Saturday, August 1, to Saturday, August 8,**

2026. We will be collaborating with the Sierra Service Project (SSP), sending a

work team from our congregation to the **Navajo Nation in Arizona.** While SSP

traditionally hosted only youth groups, in recent years, they have broadened their

mission to include intergenerational service weeks for churches, scout groups, and other organizations,

creating opportunities for a wider range of participants to serve. **Deadline to sign up: Sunday, March 8.**
